On Thursday afternoon and Friday morning, Mr. Schaff and his co-presenter will present the session "Advising Physicians about SuperGroups: A Mardi Gras Parade of Issues," providing practical tips to identify issues when physicians form or join a SuperGroup, employment terms, buy-out events, and real-life examples for counseling clients.

On Thursday, Ms. Gora and her co-presenter will present "The Past, the Present, the Future regarding Medical and Recreational Cannabis and the Myriad of Issues that Attorneys Should be Aware of from a Legal and Practical Perspective Affecting Physicians and Hospitals." The session will provide a national overview of medical cannabis, the legal implications with the storage, possession, administration, and consumption of medicinal cannabis on premises at hospitals and other licensed health care facility settings, and how to integrate medicinal cannabis into a patient's treatment plan, while also discussing how to draft policies and procedures for health facilities and professionals in connection with these topics.
