

Employment Law Update: New Jersey Minimum Wage Increases January 1st

January 1, 2020 is less than a month away. Are you prepared for the next <u>rate increase to New Jersey's</u> <u>minimum wage</u>? On January 1st, the minimum wage for most New Jersey employers will increase to \$11.00 per hour, \$10.30 per hour for seasonal and small employers (fewer than 6 employees) and agricultural employers and the cash wage for tipped workers will rise to \$3.13 per hour. Also, the minimum amount that an employee must be paid to be considered exempt from overtime (<u>provided the "duties" test is met</u>) will increase to \$684 per week or \$35,568 per year. Additionally, the threshold to be classified as a highly compensated employee will increase to \$107,432 per year.

The chart below details the new minimum wages beginning on January 1, 2020:
