New Jersey is home to some of the most complex and demanding liquor license regulations in the nation. The liquor industry is controlled by the State of New Jersey's executive branch by the Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC), a division of the Attorney General's Office but also oversees local liquor licensing boards typically controlled by municipalities.
